

## **BDL MEMBER EXPECTATIONS**

### Involvement

We don't just want our members be active only for the parade or to just carry out instructions; we want BDLs to be able to have some input, some involvement in creating the plans. That doesn't mean that, as a team leader or volunteer, you should defer your suggestions to someone else to carry out alone. The best way to make change for the better is to be a change for the better. Collaborating helps increase the actual execution of ideas, member engagement and commitment. We also look to build our bonds thru holistic outings throughout the season and highly encourage each member's participation when it's convenient.

## **Keep Commitments**

Trust is a key component of this organization, and nothing builds trust faster than keeping the commitments we make. Those who fail to keep their commitments quickly lose any loyalty and support that may have been offered.

## Consistency

Consistency is expected two-fold: On the one hand, people expect everyone to be treated the same (i.e., no favoritism), and secondly, team leaders expect consistent behavior, that you take initiative and that what you did well yesterday, you will still be able to project as a good job today.

## Respect

It costs nothing to respect each other and the payback can be immense. The simplest way to show your respect is to be on time, be responsive, listen to your team mates questions, constructive criticism, ask for clarity if need be, offer your input.

## Timely, Constructive Feedback

We all have life outside of recreational activities and sometimes make mistakes of not thoroughly reading memos and, or responding within a reasonable time frame (i.e. 24 hrs.), but ignoring it rarely helps to fix the problem. What the director, presenters and supporters need is timely, constructive feedback. If the result is not what you expect, then let a team leader or the director know, but do it in a way that allows both parties to learn and improve, so that we will know how to avoid any mistakes next time.

## Stand Up for the BDL Organization

We should look to defend our organization and protect it from criticism. Members who do that will find that their fellow members will stand by them when things are not going well, but when they don't, their members will leave them to struggle. If you want the support of your team, then you need to support year team.
